You may be aware that Midlothian Council recently published a report about the planned new school at the old Hopefield Primary site. To read the full report access the following links:

The key information from these papers is that a new two stream non-denominational school will be built on the Hopefield site to open in 2018, mainly to address the lack of space at the new Burnbrae Primary and that the Council has agreed in principle to build a new school for St Mary's. We are obviously very disappointed that this decision was taken especially as there had been a strong indication at a previous PC meeting that the Hopefield site was to be used for St Mary's. Also some of the information in the papers in relation to St Mary's is inaccurate – our current school roll is 141 NOT 118 as detailed in the report. At the moment there is no time scale or proposed site earmarked for a new St Mary's. The Parent Council has requested a response from the Council to the following four questions as a matter of urgency:

- 1. What is the latest date that a decision would need to be made on the design of the two stream replacement school (2 stream non-denominational, or 1 non-denominational, 1 denominational)?
- 2. What is the time line for agreeing the HS12 site plans with Taylor Wimpey?
- 3. When will the report into the feasibility of replacing St Mary's be finished?
- 4. What is the latest date that a catchment consultation would need to complete ahead of the start of the August 2018 school year?

Our preference would still be to have our own single campus Catholic School at the Hopefield site which would keep the school in the heart of the Community and close to our Parish Church. The Parent Council will endeavour to keep parents informed of every development and there will be a meeting with Vic Bourne the Catholic Church Rep on the Education Committee before the end of term.

Midlothian Council has already arranged for interim maintenance work to be carried out in the school over the summer to make the windows safe, wind and watertight. New water fountains will also be installed.

I would like to reassure parents that despite some ongoing maintenance problems the quality of education at St Mary's remains very high. We pride ourselves on meeting the needs of every learner in the school, and in ensuring that your child's pastoral needs are given a high priority. Visitors and supply teachers to the school, regularly comment on how well behaved the children are, how dedicated, warm and friendly the staff are and love the family feel in the school. This has nothing to do with the fabric of the building but rather the people within it and demonstrates our ongoing commitment to promoting the ethos of the school to treat everyone with respect and to learn and grow together.

As we approach the long summer holiday I am sure you will join me in thanking the staff for their hard work throughout the year. I would like to thank you for your continued support of the school and hope the children all enjoy a well deserved summer holiday.

It is with mixed emotions that I have to tell you that Mr Billy Dickson - our beloved Janny - will be leaving us at the end of this term. Billy was successful at interview for the position of Facilities Manager (posh title for Janny) at the new Gore Glen Primary School in Gorebridge.
