**NURSERY NEWS** As of today, Monday 31<sup>st</sup> October the Nursery will run morning sessions only. The Nursery provision at St Mary's will be reviewed in January 2017 as we are part of a pilot within Midlothian to explore different options around providing the 600 hours for our preschool children. More information will follow as we receive it. The afternoon children will join the morning children today with a Hallowe'en Party.

There are Uniform order slips and Pantomime payment slips due to be returned to school. Could I urge parents to send all money coming in to the school with their child in a clearly labelled envelope: CHILD'S NAME, CLASS, REASON FOR PAYMENT and not directly to the School Office — we have a cash recording system in each class so that teachers can double check that trips etc have been paid for, and this avoids congestion at the school office at the start and finish of each day. It also allows Office staff to double check payments and have all money ready for banking each morning.

**HEAD LICE** We have had significant numbers of children with head lice in school so far this year. Please check your child's hair regularly and treat when you see evidence of lice or eggs. Thank you to those parents who have informed the school when their child has Head Lice.
