Nursery Clothing and Footwear - in cold weather

Learning continues outside all year round! Wet cold weather is only a challenge if we don't have the right clothing. As we continue to offer free choice for indoor/outdoor play we are encouraging independence in dressing skills. We have limited space on coat pegs so can we ask that you pop any bags on the trolley to make it easier for your child to hang up his or her own coat. Please help us to support your child by making sure that their hats, scarves and gloves are easily accessible to them.

The easiest way we have found to do this is;

- 1. Allow them to take off their gloves and put them in their pocket.
- 2. Allow them to take off their coat then their hat and scarf and pop these items in their coat sleeves.
- 3. Encourage them to hang up their own coat. By working together to encourage this there

Loose parts

Why Loose Parts?

There are many reasons why play spaces should include a multitude of loose parts, including: Loose parts can be used anyway children choose. Loose parts can be adapted and manipulated in many ways.

Loose parts encourage creativity and imagination. Loose parts develop more skill and competence than most modern plastic toys.

Loose parts can be used in many different ways. Loose parts can be used in combination with other materials to support imagination.

Loose parts encourage open ended learning. Children choose loose parts over fancy toys.

Items needed include:

stumps, sand, gravel, twigs, wood, wooden balls, buckets, baskets, crates, boxes, logs, tyres, shells, buttons, glass beads, nuts and bolts, screws, various sizes of stones, corks, wooden pegs, various lengths and widths of tubing, and any other junk materials that you think we could make use of.
